

### Let Advent Begin



Hope, Peace, Joy and Love!

We begin our season of Advent (once again) with anticipation and expectation. As the name Advent, (I read it from somewhere) it has the same Latin root "adventure." So, we are beginning this exciting and adventurous time.

Moreover, the name Advent was adopted from the Latin word *adventus* which means "coming or arrival," translating from the <u>Greek</u> word *parousia*. According to <u>Wikipedia</u>, "In the <u>New Testament</u>, this is the term used for the <u>Second Coming of Christ</u>. Thus, the season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the 'coming of Christ' from three different perspectives: the physical

nativity in <u>Bethlehem</u>, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the <u>eschatological Second Coming</u>."

In other words, the Advent season is the time to... look for the past, the birth of Babe Jesus (the Messiah) born in a manger in Bethlehem. The promises that had been made by the prophets and they were fulfilled when Jesus came for us (who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary).

Also, the Advent season is the time to... look for the present, to look at ourselves (our condition and preparation) whether we are ready to receive Him. Do we (even) have the smallest room/space in our hearts to receive Jesus Christ the Lord? Or, our hearts – like a long ago – have "no room at the inns" for Him to be born? Unfortunately, the "secularized Christmas" – giving gifts to each other, partying with friends, waiting for Santa Claus, etc. – has become a norm even to us (believers) so that we do not intently reflect on Jesus who came for us, sincerely search for Jesus who is with us, and solemnly look forward to Jesus who will come again (in glory)!

Furthermore, the Advent season is the time to... look for/forward to the future, the (Second) coming of Christ Jesus (who will come to Judge the quick and the dead). In the Book of Revelation (22:12-13), the Lord says, "See, I am coming soon; my reward is with me, to repay according to everyone's work. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end." And in verse 20, "The one who testifies to these things says, 'Surely I am coming soon.' [And John responds] 'Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!'" This shall be our attitude and respond as well in this season of Advent, as our hearts and lives are in preparation for His (Second) Coming and in-tune with the Lord always, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come!"

Dearly beloved, let us remember the babe of Bethlehem and why He came (the past), reflect of our relationship with Him (today), and remind us of His Second Coming (the future) during this Advent season! And the Hope, Peace, Joy and Love of the Lord Jesus Christ be with you!


